Know all men by these presents that we Henry Laurencel and Johanna Frederica DeBoom, his wife, both of the City and County of San Francisco, State of California, in Consideration of certain convenants & the further consideration of the sum of Five Dollars to us in hand paid by MARIE BADAROUS wife of CORNELIUS DE BOOM of said city and county of San Francisco the receipt where of we hereby acknowledge have bargained, sold and quit-claimed and by these presents do bargain, sell and quit-claim unto the said MARIE DeBOOM and to her heirs and assigns forever all our right, title, interest, Estate, claim and demand both at law and in equity and as well in possession as in expectancy of in and to the ONE UNDIVIDED THIRD of all that certain piece of land in Said city of San Francisco commencing on Northern line of Clay Street, ninety seven (97ft.) feet Easterly from the Northeastern intersection of Clay and Kearny Streets, thence Easterly along Clay Street forty feet and six inches (40ft. 6 in.) thence Northerly one hundred and eighty feet six inches (108ft. Gin.) more or less to Merchant Street, thence Westerly along Merchant Street forty one feet and ten inches (41ft. 10 in.) thence Southerly five feet four and a half inches (5 ft. 4 1/2 in.), thence Easterly by one foot and four inches (1 ft. 4 in.), then Southerly One hundred and three feet, one and a half inches (103 ft. 1 1/2 in.) more or less to the place of Beginning. With all and Singular the Hereditaments, appurtances thereto belonging TO HAVE and TO HOLD the Same to said MARIE DeBoom her heirs and assigns forever.
