

Notes re Enquiries made for Mr. de Boon

In my visit to Messrs. Moore & Temple I learnt
that they had already written Mr. de Boon
& explained to him that Mr. Wm Woods Temple
(late of Spring Gardens S.W.) had retired from
business for some years past, & being very old
& in failing health the matter of the Marsily
business had almost entirely passed from
his recollection - Moreover, Mr. Wm Woods
Temple had kept no papers or documents
bearing upon the question they (Moore & Temple)
^{therefore} was ⁿt of opinion that it would be a waste of
time consulting him upon the business: -
Messrs. Moore & Temple have no documents
in their keeping beyond a copy of
their valuation of the property made
in January, 1869.

Upon consulting Messrs. Williams &
James (Norfolk House, Norfolk St., Strand)
Mr. Shadforth the gentleman who saw
Mr. de Boon & informed me that
they have in their possession the title
deeds of the land, also a deed from
Charles, Geo: Marsily in favour of Mrs.
Leah Marsily. The first named died
on 13 Jan. 1853, & Mrs. L Marsily on 24
Oct. 1867. They have no will from
Mrs. L Marsily in their keeping, nor
have they ever seen one.
