has seven children, they live in Morocco
where her husband has farming business.
She married her eldest daughter Agnes, 2
old to Michel de Cacqueray last July.
The wedding took place in France, at
their summer country-house, near
Grenoble, but the young couple live
also in Morocco.

My second daughter Jeanne, who is not
married has come home a few months
ago after two years spent in Indo-China
as "assistante sociale militaire" She
now manages a "Children's Home"
in Morocco not far from her sisters
but she writes it is quite calm and

like the Casablanca troubles which
were rapidly ended.
